Bathanti to Receive 2013 Hobson Prize

Joseph Bathanti has been selected to receive the Hobson Prize, which will be conferred on Monday, April 15, 2013.

Born and raised in Pittsburgh, PA, Bathanti holds B.A. and M.A. degrees in English literature from the University of Pittsburgh, as well as an M.F.A. in creative writing from Warren Wilson College. He came to North Carolina in 1976 as a VISTA Volunteer to work with prison inmates. The recipient of numerous teaching awards, he is currently a professor of creative writing at Appalachian State University, where he is also co-director of the Visiting Writers Series, director of Writing in the Field at Appalachian State University, and Watauga Global Community Writer-in-Residence.

Bathanti is the author of six books of poetry: *Communion Partners*; *Anson*

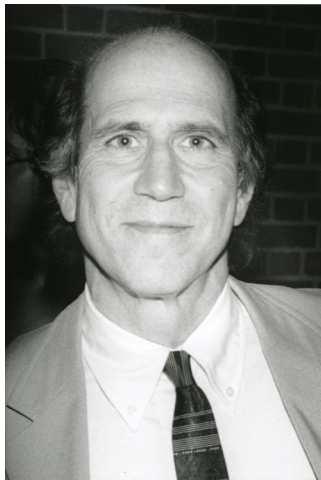

County; *The Feast of All Saints*; *This Metal*, which was nominated for The National Book Award and won the 1997 Oscar Arnold Young Award from The North Carolina Poetry Council for best book of poems by a North Carolina writer; *Land of Amnesia*, from Press 53 in 2009; and *Restoring Sacred Art*, from Star Cloud Press, winner of the 2010 Roanoke Chowan Prize, awarded annually by the North Carolina Literary and Historical Association for best book of poetry in a given year.

His first novel *East Liberty* won the Carolina Novel Award in 2001, and his latest novel *Coventry* won the 2006 Novello Literary Award. *The High Heart*, a collection of short stories, was awarded the Spokane Prize in 2006. Bathanti published *They Changed the State: The Legacy of North Carolina’s Visiting Artists, 1971-1995*, a work of nonfiction, in 2007. His

Ringing of the Bell



Located on the west side of the McDowell Columns Building in the gazebo is the Chowan University bell. "The bell dates back to the 1800s. —The bell swung from two stone pillars until 1880, when it was placed in the Bell Tower, a favorite meeting place for students. The bell was used to change classes, call students to chapel, and celebrate athletic victories." (Frank Stephenson,

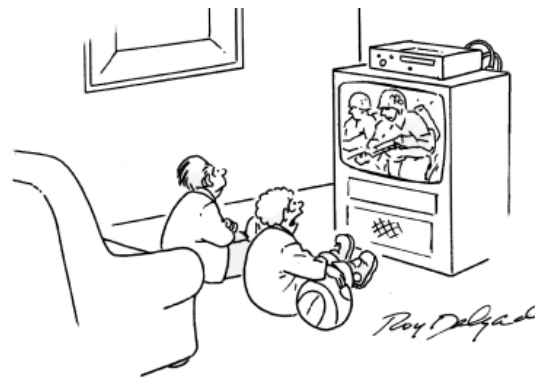

The tradition of the bell today is to establish a sense of community that begins in the first year and lasts beyond the confines of the four-year university experience. Each September, following University Convocation, faculty in full regalia and first year students proceed to the gazebo. With faculty lined up on both sides of the brick alumni walk leading to the gazebo, first-year students ring the bell to signify the beginning of their academic studies at Chowan.

The ringing of the bell is repeated again in May of each year. At the close of commencement exercises, the faculty and the graduates in their caps and gowns recess from the campus green to the gazebo. With faculty lined up on both sides of the alumni walk once again, each graduate, with diploma in hand, rings the bell one last time to signify the end of his or her academic studies at Chowan.

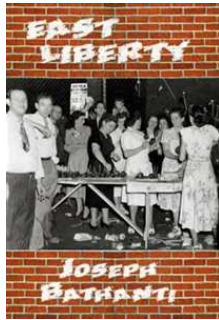

work has appeared in numerous anthologies and journals. He is a playwright, editor, lyricist and has served as a North Carolina Humanities Council Road Scholar and "Let's Talk About It" discussion series facilitator.

Bathanti is a two-time recipient of Literature Fellowships from the North Carolina Arts Council (1994 and 2009). In 1996 he received a fellowship from the Witter Bynner Foundation for Individual Poets. Also among his many honors are the Samuel Talmadge Ragan Award, the Bruno Arcudi Literature Prize, the Ernest A. Lynton Faculty Award for Professional Service and Academic Outreach, the Aniello Lauri Award for Creative Writing, the Linda Flowers Literary Award, the Sherwood Anderson Award, the Barbara Mandigo Kelly Peace Poetry Prize, and the Donald Murray Prize. The North Carolina Poetry Society recently named him 2011-12 Gilbert-Chappell Distinguished Poet for the Western Region.

Bathanti is currently a member of the Associated Writing Programs, the North Carolina Writers' Network, and the North Carolina Writers Conference. He has served on the boards of the North Carolina Arts Council, the Watauga Library, the Council of Authors and Journalists, the North Carolina Writer-in-Teacher Project, the Bring Sam Home Advisory Committee, the Iredell County HIV/AIDS Task Force, the Iredell Arts Council, and the NC Poetry Society, for which he was chair of the Zoë Kinkaid Brockman Award Committee. From 1989 to 1994, Bathanti chaired the North Carolina Writers' Network Prison project.

Jim Hammond attended the Southern District AAHPERD on February 8-11 in Orlando, Florida.

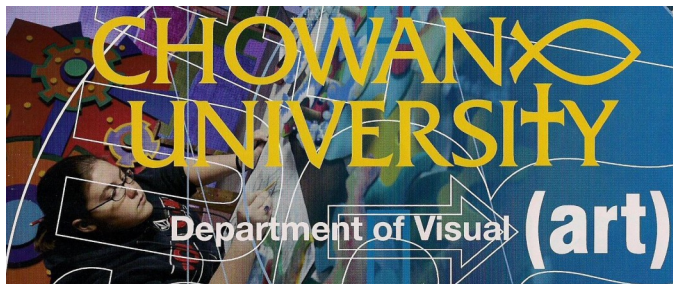
Linda Miles, Dean of the School of Business, and Tyrell Carr, Assistant Professor of Biology, attended a retention conference at Louisburg College on March 23.

Dr. William Hinkle will join the Chowan faculty as an associate professor of criminal justice in August.



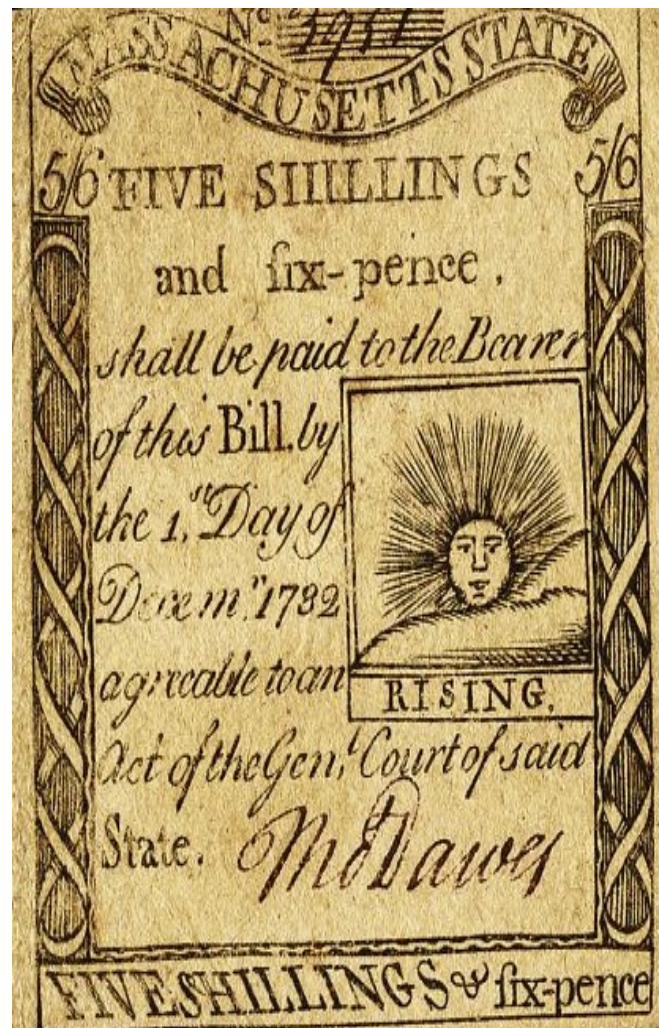
Study Abroad Trip

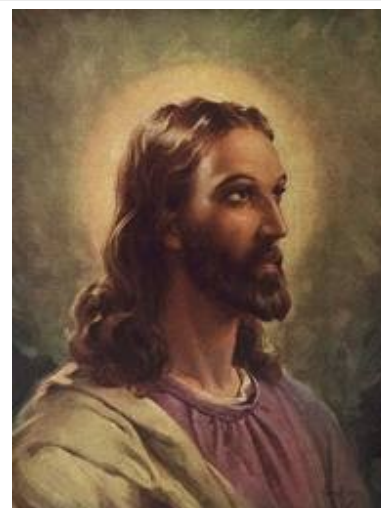

Chowan University Spring 2012 Final Examination Schedule

A final examination is to be given in all courses on the day and at the time scheduled. Rescheduling a final examination for a class requires permission from the department chair and the school dean.

A faculty member may, with the approval of the department chair, substitute other forms of evaluation appropriate to the objectives of the course for the prescribed final examination in special circumstances. In this case, the department chair approves the action and informs the school dean.

In rare cases, it may be necessary to reschedule a final examination for an individual student. The student must have permission from the dean to reschedule a final examination. Students with three or more examinations on the same day may appeal to the dean for such permission; in such cases, if necessary, the dean will assist the student in rescheduling.

ON-LINE CLASSES

Final exams for on-line classes must be scheduled during final exam week.

LESS THAN FULL-TERM CLASSES

Final exams for less than full-term classes must be scheduled for the last class meeting.
