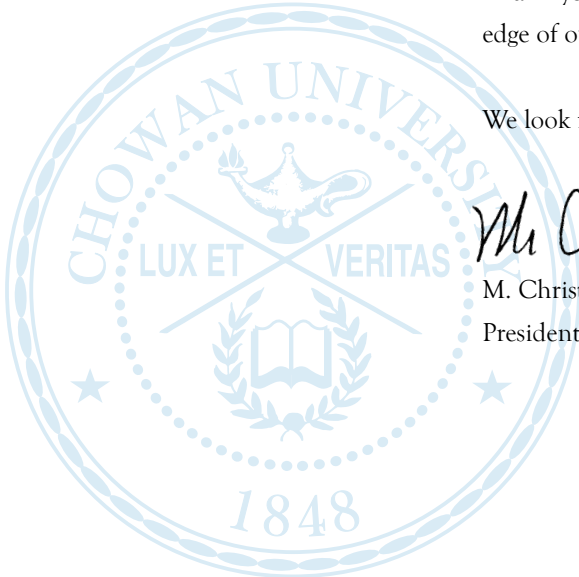



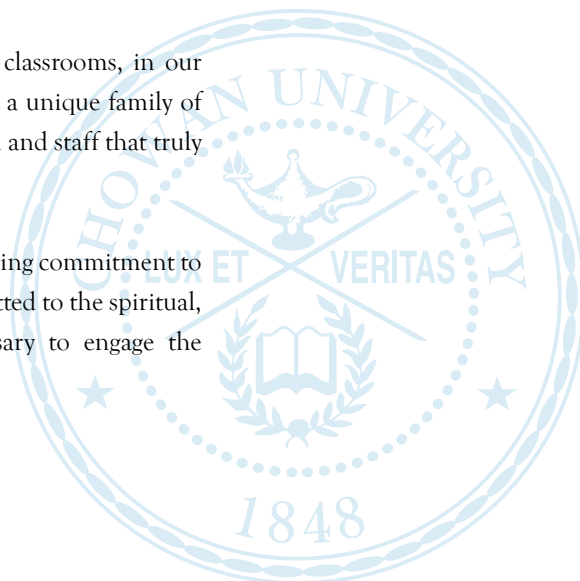
Faith in Your Future
