Dr. Gladys DeJesus Retires after 25 Years at Chowan University

Dr. Gladys DeJesus, an economist by nature and training, joined Chowan in 1993 as Associate Professor of Economics, having most recently taught at East Carolina University. In addition to ECU, she taught at other universities, both in the U.S. and abroad. She received her bachelor's degree from National University in the Dominican Republic, and her master's and doctoral degrees from The Ohio State University. She was a Fulbright Scholar, studying at Stanford University. At Chowan, the Dr. Gladys DeJesus Outstanding Economics Student Award was created in her honor.

In 2005 Dr. DeJesus was promoted to Professor of Economics, and in 2012 was awarded the rank of Distinguished Professor of Economics. At that time she also became Chair of the Department of Interdisciplinary Studies. She was the recipient of the Excel-

lence in Teaching Award in 2002 and 2012, and the Faculty Advisor of the Year Award in 2011. She has served on numerous standing and ad hoc committees, and was the Administrative Advisor to the Chowan Chapter of Alpha Lambda Delta.

Beyond the university, Dr. DeJesus is very active in her church, serving as a Spanish translator and a lector. She is a long-time member of the Rotary Club of Murfreesboro, supporting its mission and service activities. She enjoys attending the many cultural shows and performances on campus and in our region.

Dr. DeJesus and colleague Associate Professor of Marketing Patsy Taylor were well ensconced in Marks Hall, so it seemed almost traumatic when the Marks renovation required them to leave the third floor. Fortunately, some shuffling kept their offices in close proximity to one another in McSweeney Hall; it is wonderful having the two of them in the same building with us. The renovation of McSweeney provided sufficient class-room spaces for teaching here as well, thus finalizing her move from Marks Hall.

When speaking with other School of Business faculty members about her pending retirement, all expressed appreciation for the kindness and helpfulness of our colleague Dr. DeJesus. One individual pondered, "I wonder whether we'll be on time for faculty meetings now without Mama Gladys walking down the hall and urging us to hurry so we wouldn't be late." Another mentioned her lovely outfits – we sometimes wonder whether her closet houses an endless supply of beautiful blazers. In so many ways, she has touched our hearts with the warmth of her personality. She is a gracious model of professionalism.

There are not enough words to express how much we admire and appreciate Dr. DeJesus. She is thoughtful, kindhearted, and tenacious, a winning combination. We are all better people because of her.
