## Partnering for Professional Development activities for LEA Employees.

- For credit "a la carte classes" may be taught by SACSCOC quantified LEA Employees for LEA Employees using an approved Chowan University Syllabus.
- Chowan support for the LEAs "Grow Your Own" teacher development initiatives.
- Tuition discounts for Master's in the Arts of Teaching (MAT) and Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership (MOL) programs.
- Professional Development Boot Camps in pedagogy, content, classroom management and exceptional children's programming.
- Mutual engagement in professional development opportunities that may benefit members of both organizations.





## Potential Dual Enrollment Opportunities for LEA Students at Chowan University.

- Advanced students needing one or more classes not offered by the LEAs Early College could enroll at Chowan University as non-matriculating students.
- Qualifying LEA teachers could serve as adjunct faculty to teach Chowan courses at the LEA site.
- Articulation agreements for transferring students from the Early College to Chowan for classes not taught in collaboration with Chowan (follows standard credit transfer requirements).
- Students will earn Chowan and LEA course credits upon successful completion of courses that are transferable and satisfies NC high school graduation requirements.

## Academic, Athletic, Cultural and Social Enrichment Opportunities for LEA Students.

- Camps at Chowan week long, day camps, college day experiences, content area enrichment activities:
  - I. academic camps
  - 2. athletic camps.
- College Day experiences for students of all grade levels as identified by the LEA.
- Guest Lecturing Chowan content area experts could guest lecture in content area classes in person or via video conferencing.
- LEA faculty could work with Chowan faculty on meeting the needs of students living in poverty, active learning and problem-based approaches to learning.
- Swimming Lessons LEA student learning to swim from basics to Lifeguards.
- Collaboration for grant and other funding opportunities.
- Agriculture and Community Gardening Initiatives.
